


Royal Prayers

1 Peter 2 v 9

But you are a chosen people, royal priests, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession. You were chosen to tell about the wonderful acts of God, who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.



With our royalty comes responsibility, how will we use our authority to impact the world today?



Colossians 3 v 12

God has chosen you and made you his holy people. He loves you. So you should always clothe yourselves with mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.

What royal behaviours and character can you see in your friends and family today? Encourage and bless them by writing positive words about their character onto stickers or post-it notes. Stick them onto one another and pray that others would see their positive and royal behaviour too.

Royalty often sit on thrones as a symbol of their authority.

Did you know that what makes a church a 'cathedral' is a special throne called a Cathedra.

Where will you sit to connect with God today?

Why not create your own throne. Cover a chair with fabrics or special cushions. Take it in turns to sit in the throne while others pray a blessing over you.

Remember to listen to what God might want to say to you while you are seated on the throne too.



Kings, Queens, Princes and Princesses are often shown wearing amazing clothes, jewellery and crowns.

When you look at somebody royal you can see that they are special. This verse from Colossians tells us that we can dress ourselves in the character of God, showing mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

How would you like to be more royal and more like God in your behaviour?
Why not stick a post-it or sticker on yourself as an act of prayer, asking God to increase that characteristic and royal behaviour in you.

Why not make and decorate some simple crown shapes with messages about God's love and our royal identity as his children. You could place them in your community for people to find.

You could use the I am royal declaration as inspiration. e.g. You are a child of God, God has chosen you.

Just as Jesus prayed in his 'Lord's prayer', we can pray "Your Kingdom Come". What would the world look like if everybody in it knew God as their King and accepted the invitation to be part of God's royal family?

Take a walk through your local area/community and pray 'Your Kingdom Come' declaring God's rule and reign in the streets, parks, shops, houses, schools and businesses near you.

Create a piece of artwork showing what the world would look like if God's will was done on the earth as it is in heaven

Draw, paint or collage it as a prophetic declaration.
